Briefing of Kannaland Staff on the Implementation of the Financial Recovery Plan

The Municipality expressed its appreciation to the implementation teams from Provincial Treasury, Local Government, MFIP advisors, and municipal officials who continue to provide support and expertise in driving the FRP forward.

Kannaland Municipality reaffirms its commitment to transparency, accountability, and collaboration in this journey. The briefing marks the beginning of a broader programme of staff engagement and community communication, ensuring that everyone is informed, involved, and empowered to contribute to the municipality's turnaround.
